Tallinn Declaration on eGovernment, 6th Oct. 2017

- “Digital progress is transforming our societies and economies to the core”.
- “Our efforts can be greatly facilitated by collaboration, interoperable solutions and sharing of good practices throughout public administrations and across borders.”

New technologies + old habits => need for leaders

- Early 20th Century: Electric engines operating in a steam-based paradigm
- 20 years for really productivity gains to appear
- A generation of managers to retire
- Do we live in a similar era?
- We have technologies, we lack procedures, business processes, organizational structures, mentality and culture to exploit them
- Should we wait for our generation to retire?
- Or radically rethink, redesign and transform we run public administration?

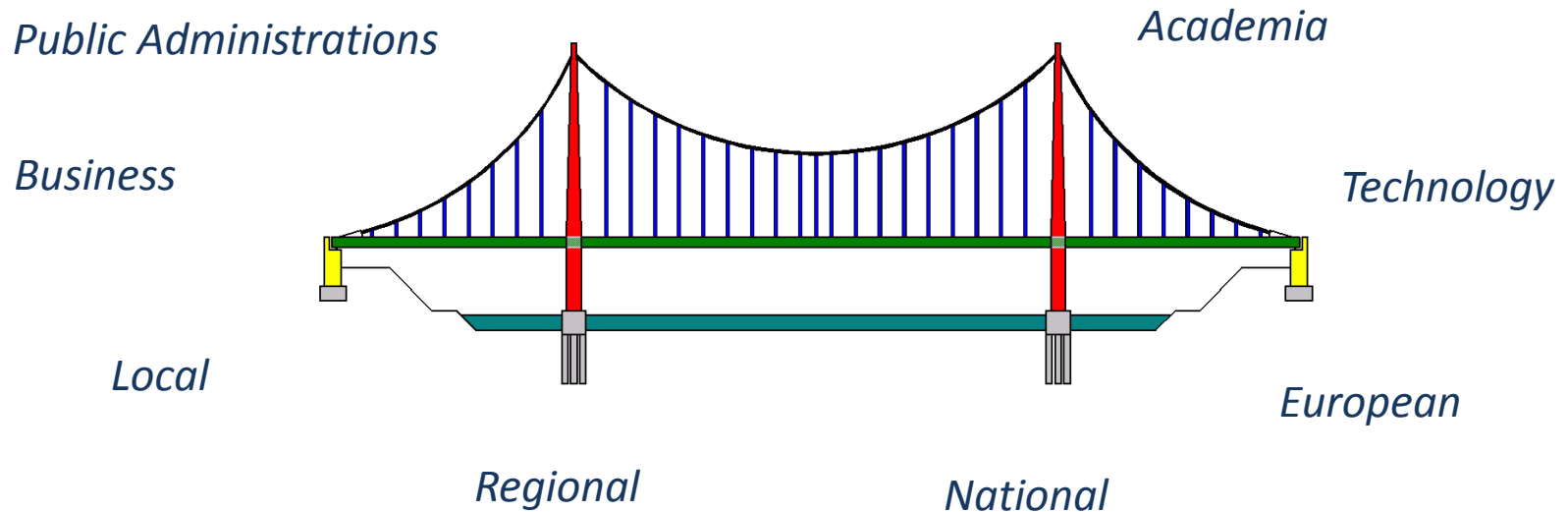
